

Pastoral
Letter
Robert writes





My dear friends

As I looked back at my computer files for the last time, I wrote a Parish Letter for the month of May I noted that it was in 2021. In that letter, I wrote about the death of HRH Duke of Edinburgh and the post Covid road map to normality.

How much has changed and happened since then!

For most of us the gradual emergence from the wettest winter on record and, hopefully, into a drier, warmer Spring is a huge relief and a sense of hope that the worst is behind us.

The season of Easter was early this year, arguably as early as it can be in the calendar year which, to me, heightened the sense of anticipation of better times to come against the backdrop of Winter. Even though much better weather was yet to arrive, the scattering of drier sunnier days amid the wet indicated improvement.

As I start to cut grass, I note the underlying soil is still very wet, too wet to do a harsh cut without ripping up the roots so "topping off" is the order of the day to start with. Though Easter may have been early, the growing season is late in starting. I have no doubt it will be busy times ahead as nature catches up quickly and enthusiastically.

Such is life in the world of gardening and farming, yet those of us not directly involved in either can also get a sense of things getting better. Longer hours of daylight, warmer temperatures, a more cheerful daily greeting between friends and neighbours, the sound of birdsong in the mornings as the annual mating, territorial marking and nest building be-

gins. Such things lift our spirits far more than we might easily recognise.

Going from gloom and sadness to acceptance and new beginnings is never instantaneous. It takes time, and may be a little internal effort, to process the events of the past and move more hopefully to a new and different future. Even the significance great events of Easter took time to sink into those most closely linked with them. The famous story of Doubting Thomas is indicative of this as are the other post-resurrection, pre-Ascension stories.

As Springtime proceeds towards Summer, bringing with it the first signs of new beginnings, So Easter heralds new beginnings for all people of the Christian faith, no matter how long their active Christian life may have been.

Blessings to you all.

A few garden maintenance jobs are: clearing weeds from ponds and water features. Put soft tops on all canes to prevent injury. Apply wood treatment as necessary. Apply a nitrogen rich summer lawn feed to encourage leafy growth, grass seed or new turf needs to be done by end of the month. Hoe bare soil and hand-weed beds so they do not have time to establish and set seed.

Big Mission Weekend, with the Archbishop of Canterbury Over the May Bank Holiday, Friday 24 to Sunday 26 May, the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Most Revd Justin Welby, will be coming to the Diocese to join in with our mission and vision. Friday 24 May



Archbishop Justin will start by having

breakfast with farmers in the North Cotswolds. They will have some big conversations about issues affecting farmers, environmental considerations and care for creation.

He'll then meet children at two of our Gloucestershire schools, answering their questions and joining in with singing and worship on an environmental theme.

After lunch, he'll visit a church where the community have set up a thriving café and shop and get to know some of the team who volunteer there, as well as being trained up to make a delicious latte.

At 5pm, Archbishop Justin will be joining Evening Prayer at St John Baptist Church in Cirencester. All are welcome to this service.

Dinner will be at The Grace Network, which supports social enterprises that reinvest profits into their local communities. Guests will have the chance to put their questions to the Archbishop and find out more about how his faith has shaped the person he is today.

#### Saturday 25 May

The day begins with a service of morning prayer and a Messy Church session in Gloucester. The Archbishop will have a go at some crafts, singing and chatting with the children and families who worship here.

He'll set off on a prayer walk through Gloucester, stopping for an ice cream on the way to chat to some local Christian business owners and see how their faith plays out in their business. He will be popping into a not-for-profit community café, before getting a steam-punk angle on Gloucester's Tall Ships Festival.

At 1pm to 3.30pm, the Archbishop will be involved in a community fun day run by Sportily, full of lots of sports and activities, at Longford Skate Park. Come along for a coffee and an ice cream and practise your map-reading skills in our treasure hunt.

As a diocese, we believe that people deserve to live in homes that are safe, stable, sustainable, social and satisfying. The Archbishop will find out more about how the Diocese is locally supporting better housing provision.

Young people in Cheltenham have invited the Archbishop to come and join in their regular worship session and then he will end the day with a meal with partners from across the diocese. Bishop Rachel will interview Archbishop Justin and there will be a question-and-answer session about Christian faith and mission.

#### Sunday 26 May

Archbishop Justin will travel to Tidenham in the Forest of Dean to join in worship, which is open to the local community.

The weekend ends with a celebration diocesan Eucharist (Holy Communion) service at Gloucester Cathedral at 3pm. Please do come and join us for this joyful service of celebration and thankfulness.

parent or grandparent of some passengers and even a Bay named for one of the passengers. It's a rare treat to visit a place with the person from whom it got its name. (Antarctic) Place names are allocated for navigation, science, safety, or protection. (In biology there is a move to remove names of individuals from birds and animals.)

People's names have long been derived from places, sometimes to comic effect in the house of Lords, and it's polite to get them right, but names remain far more significant in other cultures.

Indeed the church now often sounds evasive, 'praise the name of the Lord' instead of praising the Lord, or off-putting first priority: 'hallowed be thy name'.

There was small Ukrainian chapel at the Vernadsky base, previously Faraday (or Base F), which was sold to Ukraine for a pound by the UK after the Russians had grabbed all the ex-Soviet facilities. St. Volodymyr's chapel was built in 2011, and now has a yellow door and a blue wall. The first priority on taking over a British base was to add a sauna. The bar, wiring and humour has been retained. The base is where the ozone hole was first detected. Nearby, our Zodiac was checked out by a curious Minke whale and we check out a sleeping humpback whale.

The low cloud base for most of the trip meant that we did not see what are now called the Una Peaks, but being with a group with diverse but overlapping interests there were plenty of lectures on how some animals sleep while diving, or the finding of the Endurance wreck as well as the geology of the area and the complexities of ice in an area with significant warming. (It was not freezing at any time when I was there.) If all the ice melts, the coast would run along. Shurdington Road






